Injury: Fell from roof

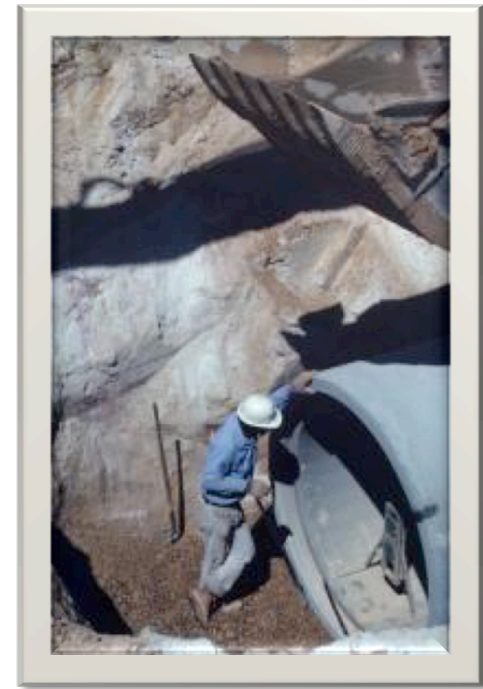
